Paul's Portion

Today is Easter. For many it is a celebration of Jesus' victory over death as He rose from the tomb. For many others it is a celebration of brightly colored eggs and chocolate of various shapes and sizes. Still others simply see this day as a celebration of staying in bed a little longer. The question perhaps that should be raised is this, "How should this day be viewed?" We have Paul's words in Galatians 4:10 where he seems to be condemning the Galatians for placing more importance on some days. We, however, also have Paul's teaching in Romans 14:5&6 where he is saying that whether we esteem one day above another is our business as long as our motive is to honor God. Where then does that leave us as far as celebrating Easter? It is true that we are to celebrate Jesus' resurrection every day and especially on Sundays as we partake of the bread and fruit of the vine. Does this mean that we can not, or should not ever celebrate a little more than usual? I have a daughter. I love my daughter very much and, in a sense, every day I celebrate the fact that my daughter was born. Likewise, I have a wife who I love, and every day I celebrate that she is my wife. With both my daughter and my wife I also have a special celebration or recognition of the day that they each came into my life; my daughter's birthday and my wife and my anniversary. Celebrating my daughter's birthday or my wedding day does not in any way cause me to appreciate my daughter or my wife any less the other 364 days of the year. Why then do we think that it somehow lessens our appreciation of Jesus and our regular acknowledgment of His resurrection to celebrate Easter? Naturally, there are two things that we need to keep in perspective. If we are going to celebrate Easter it has to be in accordance with Paul's admonition in Romans 14. That is we must observe Easter with the right motive, bringing honor and glory to God. This means we focus on Christ and His resurrection; not baskets, candy, eggs or the bunny. Even if we ascribe religious meaning to these objects they distract from the event itself. Also, we must be sure that we do not celebrate the day. Even if, in contrast with Christ's birth, we have a pretty good idea of the actual day of Christ's resurrection it is the event not the day that we celebrate. So, happy Easter, and remember to celebrate it tomorrow as well.
