### Paul’s Portion

A couple of days ago Leonard Nimoy passed away. Although he had a long and varied career with appearances in movies, television shows, commercials, stage plays and even records he will always be defined as “Mr. Spock” from the Star Trek franchise. For those who are not fans of Star Trek, Spock was a Vulcan (Actually half Vulcan and Half human). As a Vulcan Spock would give the traditional farewell, “Live long and prosper.” From the Vulcan perspective this is accomplished through a life dictated by logic. This is not the same approach that the Christian takes for a long, prosperous life. In fact many would say that the Christian’s approach to life instead of being logical is illogical. This is not a surprise since the world’s idea of logic and wisdom is not the same as God’s. Not only are God’s logic and the world’s logic not the same, you could even say that they are in opposition to each other. The Apostle Paul says about the world’s wisdom, “Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world?” 1 Corinthians 1:20. Paul goes on in 1 Corinthians 3:18-19 to state, “<sup>18</sup>Let no one deceive himself. If anyone among you thinks that he is wise in this age, let him become a fool that he may become wise. <sup>19</sup>For the wisdom of this world is folly with God. For it is written, “He catches the wise in their craftiness.” Still, just because the Christian approaches life differently, with a different wisdom, than the world that does not mean that the Christian does not experience a full and prosperous life. Rather, the Christian has a fuller and more prosperous life than those who live life by the world’s standards. This is a promise we have from Jesus Himself, for in John 10:10 Jesus says that He “came that they may have life and have it abundantly.” As an added benefit, it is not for this life only that the Christian has the promise of an abundant life. Actually, if it was for this life only that the Christian lived Paul says that we are to be pitied, 1 Corinthians 15:19. Praise the Lord that it is not this life only that is promised to the Christian. As God blesses us in this life He will bless us even more in the life to come. The true abundant life will be the life we know when we are gathered up to God’s throne. Thus, when the Christian says to live long and prosper we mean eternally in the prosperity of heaven. This blessing goes well beyond any blessing from Spock.
