Today’s Bible Reading

Luke 5:8, English Standard Version.

8But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus’ knees, saying, “Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord.”

Paul’s Portion

The human body is amazing, such as its ability to heal itself. As humans live out their lives they will inevitably get injured. When a person gets a cut the body goes into repair mode; blood will flow to that injury to clean it and go through a complex process to cause clotting to close up the wound. As the blood clots a scab is formed over the wound. In time the scab will be absorbed back into the body as the wound continues to heal. Although there is always some scarring from this process many times the scarring is unnoticeable. Obviously this is a very simplified explanation of what occurs in the healing process. One thing to notice in this process is the fact that from the moment the injury occurs until the moment that it is healed there is progress toward that healing. Imagine if any of the steps in that process did not occur. What if when you received an injury causing a gash in your arm the blood did not flow to create a clot; instead you had to walk around for the rest of your life with a big hole in your arm. Imagine that the blood flowed to the injury but it did not clot but just continued to bleed out. Imagine if the scab never went away. All of these steps in the healing process occur as God has planned and you can see the progress being made. The same type of progress is seen when our spiritual wounds are being healed. When the body comes into contact with sin it causes gashes to our spiritual body. When those gashes come we need healing to occur. Much as with our physical bodies there are steps to our spiritual healing as well, and each of those steps are necessary and should be evident. As with the physical wounds our spiritual wounds need blood for healing. For spiritual wounds this blood is provided by Jesus, and it serves to clean and cover the wound. Just as with our physical wounds the blood is not the last step. John the baptizer told the Pharisees and scribes to “Bear fruit in keeping with repentance.” Matthew 3:8. Likewise, when Paul was teaching about Jesus he also taught the people “that they should repent and turn to God, performing deeds in keeping with their repentance,” Acts 26:20. You might say that a life of repentance is the spiritual scab. This is again a simplified explanation of the spiritual healing process. As with Physical healing this process requires all of the steps and should be evident as the sin wound is being healed.
