Paul's Portion

Have you ever stopped to consider how many things we do just to have to do them again. We make our beds in the morning just to mess them up at night and have to make them again the next morning. We mow the lawn (when it stops raining long enough to allow us to) just to have to mow it again in a matter of days. We iron our clothes just to have them become wrinkled and need ironing again. Obviously there are many more examples that could be listed. Why is it that we do all of these things that we do just to have to do them again? To be honest, there are many people who do not go to the trouble. Many people do not make their beds, or iron their clothes. These people have decided that it is just not worth it to go through the same routine over and over. They are content to live with unmade beds and wrinkled clothes etc. There are those who view repentance in this way as well. They do not see the logic in repenting and turning to Christ, since you are just going to sin again. Some argue that once they know that they will not sin anymore than they will go to Christ. Others simply have a defeatist attitude. They don't see the point in having their sins washed away (Acts 22:16) since they are just going to sin again. This is reminiscent of the little boy who tried to reason with his mother that there was no point in him taking a bath since he was just going to get dirty again tomorrow. Admittedly it can be tedious to do the ironing every day knowing that the clothes are just going to get wrinkled again, and it can be tedious to make the bed every Morning. What if they made beds that would make themselves and self ironing clothes? What if once you made the bed or ironed the clothes you never had to do it again because whenever needed they would take care of it themselves? We have that with the washing of our sins. Once we have taken care of our sins through the blood of Jesus Christ we become a new creation with an automatic cleanse cycle. John describes it this way, “But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin.” 1 John 1:7. This is not a free license to sin, as Paul points out in Romans 6:1-2. It is a reassurance that it is worth it to come to Christ for cleansing; even if we may sin again. Wearing wrinkled clothes is nothing compared to wearing our sins.
