Paul's Portion

There is, what I guess you would call a joke, that says, everyone complains about the weather, but no one does anything about it. You can see the same thing with politics. Many people complain about the politicians and the job they are doing, but they don't do anything about it. We just had an election this past Tuesday, and I would be willing to bet that the majority of the loud complainers didn't even bother to vote. I suppose the message the joke is trying to put across is that if you don't like something don't just complain, do something about it. Understandably, we can't really do anything about the weather, that is God's department, but there are many other areas where we can do something. This is true with politics, but it is also true with the world in general. You can hear all the time people complaining about the crime, violence, drugs and other downfalls of the human race. Yet, how often does anyone actually do anything to try to improve the world around them? There is an old saying, that is possibly from a Chinese proverb, that states, "It is better to light a candle than to curse the darkness." I think the Chinese proverb got its philosophy from Jesus' words in Matthew 5:15, "Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house."
