Paul's Portion

Time is a very peculiar thing. Everyone is familiar with sayings concerning time, such as “Time flies when you are having fun,” then on the other end of that, “Time stood still.” People make these statements while all the time realizing that they are not true. Time does not fly nor does it stand still, (with the exception of when Joshua prayed for time to stop, Joshua 10-12-13). As a general rule, however, time is pretty much a constant. Not only is time a constant it is the same for everyone. People in one part of the world do not have more time than people in other parts of the world. Some parts of the world have more sunlight than others, but time is time. Time is time for humanity that is, God being the creator of time is not limited by time and thus time is not the same for the Lord as it is for humanity. Peter even addresses this “But do not overlook this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day,” 2 Peter 3:8. It may seem that the Summer just flew by, but in actuality time moved at the same pace through the Summer months that it does through the Winter months. Everyone had the same amount of time. Why is it then that there are students scrambling to get their Summer projects finished before school starts? The problem is not that the students had less time, but that they didn't best utilize their time. Most assuredly a large portion of them felt that they had “All the time in the world.” Now they are feeling the crunch, because “all the time in the world” is about to expire. This thinking of having all the time in the world is not just a problem with students. Many people have this attitude when it comes to doing “religious” things. They are in no rush to obey the Gospel, or spread the Gospel, for they feel that there is plenty of time. Jesus told His disciples, “We must work the works of him who sent me while it is day; night is coming, when no one can work,” John 9:4. Jesus understood that He only had a short span of time on this earth to do what He had to do. Time almost certainly seemed to fly by for Jesus as He helped people, but knew that there were many that could be helped. On the other hand time probably dragged on as Jesus waited until He could once more be by the Father's side. Are you ready for the night?
