Paul's Portion

We did not think through our pet choices very well. We have a black cat and a blonde dog. The thing about animals is that they shed, constantly. This means that we are constantly covered with fur. If we are wearing light colors then the black cat's fur is seen. If we are wearing dark colors the blonde dog's fur is seen. The result of all of this shed fur, besides a clogged vacuum, is that people can instantly know that we have pets. They only need to look at us and they see the evidence of our pets, we are covered in it. Although, they can see the fur sticking to our clothing and know that we have pets this alone will not tell them what kind of pets that we have. If people see fur on our clothing and want to know what kind of pets we have they either have to ask about them, or we have to volunteer the information. My wife is good at volunteering the information, usually in an apologetic way, "Sorry, about the fur, we have a dog and a cat and they shed a lot." This past week while I was yet again vacuuming up fur I realized that pet owners and Christians have a lot in common. Pet owners are covered with shed fur and Christians are covered in Christ's shed blood, Hebrews 13:12. Thus, people should be able to see the evidence of our Savior. Like with pets, however, people may be able to see that we have a Savior, but may not know what kind of Savior we have just by looking at us. We like to think that people will automatically be able to tell what kind of "Christian" we are just by looking at us. We even quote verses such as John 13:35. The truth is that unless they ask us, or unless we volunteer the information, the majority of the populace will not know our Savior from the rest of the "good religious people". Unfortunately, many times the way that people volunteer information about their Savior or their faith is the way my wife volunteers information about our pets. That is to say that they are almost apologetic about it. We read in Mark 8:38 that Jesus said, "For whoever is ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the Son of Man also be ashamed when He comes in the glory of His Father with the holy angels.." When people see the evidence of Christ in our lives we need to confess with pride who He is and that we are His.
