Paul's Portion

There was a time when people would laugh at the grammatical error others made in prayers, announcements, and bulletins of saying, "sick of the church," or "sick of the congregation". What was meant was, members of the church or congregation who were sick. What they were saying, however, was that there were people who were sick of the church or congregation. As mentioned, this used to be a grammatical error causing some amusement. While there may still be some grammatical error instances, there are also growing instances where what is intended is exactly what is stated. A number of people seem to be sick of the church, and an even larger number of people seem to be sick of their congregation. When someone is sick it is generally because they have come in contact with something that has disagreed with them. People may ingest something that is tainted, or they may come into contact with a germ or virus strain that disagrees with them thus, causing them to become ill. Taking this to the realm of the church we can apply the same basic principles. People today get sick of their church or their congregation when they come into contact with something that disagrees with them. At times the thing that disagrees with them is a doctrinal issue, but more often than not, it is the personality or actions of one or more of the members. What should be the action of a Christian who becomes sick of the congregation? There are passages that deal with Christian to Christian conduct. We can go to passages such as, Matthew 5:21-26, 18:15-17, 22; John 13:34; Romans 12:14-21; 1 Thessalonians 5:12-15, and others. These passages teach us that we are to work things out with our Christian brethren when they make us sick. Is the instruction the same when the disagreeing catalyst is of a doctrinal nature? When we read passages such as, Matthew 7:15-16; Acts 18:25-26, 19:1-5; 2 Thessalonians 3:6; Titus 3:9-11, and others; we see again that we are to try and work things out. When we are unable to work things out then we are not to have anything to do with the one causing the sickness. What we will not find is scripture condoning complaining about feeling sick, spreading our sickness, or running away from what is making us sick. It is sad that sometimes people are sick of church, but when it happens scripture should be followed for the cure.
