Paul’s Portion

A memory I have from my teenage years was when I said the wrong thing to my father. What I had said was, “You’re crazy” I was not really calling my father insane, I had said, “You’re crazy” as a figure of speech to emphasize how different our opinions were on a subject. The subject was over which we disagreed is not why this moment has stuck in my head all these years. This moment has not even stuck in my mind because of what I said, but because of my father’s reaction to what I said. Those two words, though spoken with no ill will, or seriousness, caused my father pain. For him, it was a great insult and attack on him to even hint that he might be crazy. This reaction is understandable. For many years there was a horrible stigmatism associated with being “crazy”. Mental institutions were places of horror. Besides this, the idea of being out of your mind can be frightening to say the least. Does it, however, have to be that way? Often the litmus test over whether someone is insane or sane is based solely of whether the person goes along with the normal thinking of society. With that criteria of being sane I dare say that there are many times that I would rather be considered insane rather than go along with the majority thought. I further suggest that it is not always a bad thing to be considered insane. You could very well find yourself in some mighty good company. The apostle Paul was accused of being insane, “And as he was saying these things in his defense, Festus said with a loud voice, “Paul, you are out of your mind; your great learning is driving you out of your mind,” (Acts 26:24). Jesus was accused of being out of His mind in at least two separate occasions, “Many of them said, ‘He has a demon, and is insane; why listen to him?’” (John 10:20); “And when His family heard it, they went out to seize Him, for they were saying, ‘He is out of his mind,’” (Mark 3:21). Why were Paul and Jesus considered insane by the crowds? It was because they were declaring the truth of God’s word, a truth that is foolishness to the lost, (1 Corinthians 1:18). If it is foolishness to the world then we will seem insane to proclaim it. Still proclaim it we must. So, let the world say I am crazy. I would rather be with God and thought crazy than be really be crazy by being without God.
