Today's Bible Reading

Psalms 1:1-4, English Standard Version.

“¹Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers; ²but his delight is in the law of the LORD, and on His law he meditates day and night. ³He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers. ⁴The wicked are not so, but are like chaff that the wind drives away.”

Paul's Portion

It may not be true in other parts of the world, but in the United States there seems to be a real problem with the attitude of self entitlement. To put it simply people spend too much time striving to achieve happiness and success for themselves. This is not to say that it is wrong to be happy. James instructed us to sing praise when we are happy, James 5:13, so there should be times when Christians are happy. The problem is when people put being happy as the first priority. I personally know of at least two marriages that ended in divorce because one of the spouses thought that they were entitled to more happiness than they were receiving in their marriage. Recently I read the following statement, “Never regret anything that once made you smile.” I do not recall where I saw this statement, but it gave me cause to pause and think. Don't regret anything that made you smile, oh really? Does the fact that something made you smile, automatically mean that it must have been a good thing? The Pharisees of Jesus' time come to mind. Jesus rebuked them by saying that they loved the places of honor and the greetings, Matthew 23. Sitting in their places of honor and hearing people give them their special greetings most assuredly made these Pharisees smile, but they will regret those times at the judgement seat. There is also the example of Demas. Paul states that because Demas was so in love with the world he deserted him. One has to imagine that whatever aspect of the world Demas was in love with it made him smile. Just like with the Pharisees, however, he most assuredly has or will regret those “happy” moments. This idea of not regretting anything as long as it made you smile smacks of the philosophy from not too many years ago, “If it feels good do it.” This is a dangerous lifestyle. One needs to be cautious about what makes you smile. Perhaps the key is to approach life with the attitude of seeking those things to make you smile that you will not regret. Christianity is, remember, not opposed to smiling and being happy. Rather, Christianity is about the ultimate happiness which comes from being in the Lord. This is reflected in John's words of 3 John 1:4, “I have no greater joy than to hear that my children are walking in the truth.” This is what should really make us smile.
