Paul's Portion

Yesterday I passed a church building that had the message, "God loves you as you are" on its sign. I imagine that whoever put up that message was thinking that God is love, (1 John 4:8,16), and that we love because He first loved us, (1 John 4:19), and probably even the fact that God so loved the world that He sent His only son, (John 3:36). While it is true that God is love, and the inventor of love, I fear that it sends the wrong message to say that, "God loves you as you are." You are a murderer, no problem, God loves you as you are. You are an adultery, don't worry about it, God loves you as you are. You are a homosexual, that's ok, God loves you as you are. You are an idolator, no fears, God loves you as you are. I could go on, but I believe the point is made. I may be mistaken, but I can't think of a single scripture that teaches that God loves us just as we are. Let me be clear. To say that, "God loves us just as we are" is different from saying that, "God loves us despite how we are". In the second instance the message is that God loves us because we are made in His image, we are His creation, and thus He loves us as a Father would love His children, even if they disappoint Him. In the first instance the message is that God loves us and is perfectly happy with us, not matter if we follow His commands, His will, and His desires or not. Rather than saying that the Lord loves everyone, even those who engage in sinful activities, scripture says, "The LORD tests the righteous, but his soul hates the wicked and the one who loves violence." (Psalm 11:5), and "You destroy those who speak lies; the LORD abhors the bloodthirsty and deceitful man" (Psalm 5:6). We do people a disservice when we let them think that the Lord will love them no matter what. Here is the danger, although many people understand the concept that the Lord disciplines those He loves, (Hebrews 12:6), they equate discipline with some irritation here on earth. They further believe it will be all right in the end. The thinking is that, since God loves them He may discipline them, but He would never subject them to eternal torment. Thus, there is no demand for them to change from their sinful lifestyle. Jesus makes it plain in Luke 13:3&5, "Unless you repent you shall perish". God loves you, not as you are, but to make you better than you are.
