Paul’s Portion

This coming Tuesday there will be celebrations throughout the United States of America. It is probably safe to say that most of those celebrations will include some form of firework display. Over the years fireworks have gotten more and more spectacular. It is not uncommon to hear “oohs” and “aahs” coming from the crowd as the skyrockets burst high above, lighting up the sky. The fourth of July and fireworks make me think of the expression, “She’s a real firecracker.” In most instances this is meant to be a compliment. It means to suggest that the person is feisty and full of life. Naturally, it could also be seen as having the meaning that the person is loud and explosive, but we prefer the positive thought. Even when we take the positive approach of “being a firecracker” a problem remains. That problem is that firecrackers have a short life. With a firecracker you light the fuse, then in a matter of minutes the firecracker goes off, and then it is all over. Even the spectacular skyrockets that shake the ground with their “boom” and light up the sky last but a moment. Thus, though it may seem desirable to be a firework, those who are in Christ are called to be more than a firework. Christians are to be spectacular, heard, and light, but they are to last more than a brief moment. We are to be spectacular as Paul and Silas were when they were accused of turning the world upside down, (Acts 17:6). We are to be lasting like Paul when he said that he pressed on, (Philippians 3:12-14) which encourages us to do likewise. We are to be heard as the apostles were on the day of Pentecost when all in Jerusalem heard them proclaiming the Gospel, (Acts 2). Christians are also to be light. Fireworks light up the sky, but Christians are to be light to the world, not just a small part of the sky, (Matthew 5:14). Furthermore, Christians are to be brighter than even the brightest sky rocket. Jesus told His followers that there was going to be a time when the righteous would shine like the sun, (Matthew 13:43). Fireworks have evolved over the years from small noise makers to impressive, explosive spectacles. Christians are also to evolve, or grow, through the years. As the Christian grows and learns more about the Gospel they are able to be a brighter and louder force in the world.
