It is "Father's Day" today, and I am celebrating my fifteenth year as a father. I do echo the sentiment of many fathers, it would be nice if children came with an instruction manual. I also at times feel that it would be a good idea if a person had to take a class and pass a readiness test before they were allowed to be a father. We have to face reality and admit that there are men out there who may have fathered children, but they are not a father. Then again, I am thrilled that I did not have to pass any kind of test before being allowed to be a father. I am thrilled, because I am sure that I would have not passed said test. I freely admit that I have made mistakes in my fifteen years of being a father. Thankfully, none of my fatherly mistakes resulted in death or dismemberment of my child. There was that one close call where I was showing my wife how I could hold our toddler over my head and the little darling wriggled right out of my hands. Luckily, I caught her (sort of). As I think of my attempt at fatherhood, and the mistakes I have made, and the mistakes that I know are coming in the future it can be a little disheartening. That is where the Bible comes in. God knows that it is tough being a father, remember He is one Himself. Knowing that it is tough to be a father the Lord, in His infinite wisdom, filled the Bible with examples of men being fathers. Some of these examples are of men being great fathers, such as Jairus (Mark 5:22ff). We can look at these examples think, "oh, that is how you do it," and make ourselves better fathers. Then there are examples showing men being typical fathers, mistakes and all. A mistake ridden father that comes to mind is Jacob. You would think with all of the kids he had Jacob would be a pro at the father thing, yet he messed up badly. You could say that Jacob's main mistake as a father was in showing partiality. Jacob gave Joseph that fancy coat, (Genesis 37:3) and then later he caused the people to be delayed going into Egypt because he was babying Benjamin (Genesis 42:38). We look at these examples and think. "I sure don't want to make that mistake," which also makes us into better fathers. If we really want to be the best father we possibly can, we simply look to God and shoot at emulating Him and His fatherly technique. Happy Father's day Lord!
