Paul's Portion

Yesterday was “Sweetest Day,” husbands if you are just now learning this, it is too late. You could always use the excuse that it is not a real holiday, but for some reason most wives are not satisfied with that answer. It would be nice if we could use Galatians 4:10, where Paul is berating the Galatians saying, “You observe days and months and seasons and years,” as an excuse for not getting our wife something for Sweetest Day. “Hey Honey, I would have gotten you something for Sweetest day, but Paul wrote that we shouldn't observe special days.” Unfortunately, Paul was warning them about falling back into observing Pagan holy days, not warning against observing made up holidays which are for spoiling your loved one. Besides, the wife would counter with Paul's words in, Romans 14:5-6a, “⁵One person esteems one day as better than another, while another esteems all days alike. Each one should be fully convinced in his own mind. ⁶The one who observes the day, observes it in honor of the Lord...” She would simply say, “See Honey, it is good to give me a present on Sweetest Day, because you can honor the Lord in so doing.” Naturally, the real issue is not whether or not a husband remembers that it is Sweetest Day, the real issue is whether or not a husband remembers that his wife is his sweetest every day. This of course means that he is to treat her with love, honor, and respect everyday, no matter what the calendar may say. The Biblical instruction states that husbands are to love their wives as “Christ loved the church,” “As their own bodies,” as themselves (Ephesians 5:25,28,33). This is a tall order, but one that every husband is to strive to fill. The bottom line is that husbands should not need a special day as a reason for treating their wives special, they should do it every day. An added benefit of treating husbands treating their wives as special every day is that they do not have to remember things like Sweetest Day, because the wives will not worry about days like Sweetest Day. If you are treated like a loved queen everyday are you really going to worry about a day set aside for you to be treated like a loved queen? Having said that, there is, however, nothing wrong with giving your loved one a little extra attention once in awhile, even on a made up holiday.
