Paul’s Portion

When you are typing in an address on your computer browser you need to be careful that you type correctly. Sometimes you will accidentally type the wrong thing and a window, or windows, come up that is not what you wanted. Luckily, most of the time it is a harmless website. There are, however, instances where not so harmless websites open due to error in typing an address. Some unscrupulous people will actually obtain domain names that are very similar to popular websites. For instance they may obtain the domain, “CincinnatiBengels.com” counting on people misspelling the name. Then when someone accidentally types “bengals” instead of “bengals” they are taken to the fraudulent website where they can be exposed to viruses, pornography, or at the least sales pitches. Therefore, people really need to make sure they are typing in their web addresses properly. Similarly, people need to be careful when they are doing a search for religion and Church. There are many people who are counting on people doing their searches improperly. Remember that whole disguising as angels of light that Paul mentions in 2 Corinthians 11:14? The thing about websites is that you can usually tell pretty soon when you are on the wrong site. It is not always that easy when it comes to realizing you are on the wrong site for worship or Christian instruction. Granted there can be some giveaways. If you walk into a church building and there is a huge altar there for sacrifices, you can pretty much guarantee that you are in the wrong place. Other times it is not so obvious, which is why John instructs to “test the spirits” (1 John 4:1). Of course a rule of thumb is to always be careful, as Paul instructed the Ephesian elders, Acts 20:28, and as Peter instructed in 1 Peter 5:8. We don’t want one little slip to lead us anywhere that we don’t wish to go.
