Paul’s Portion

I held a yard sale over the last couple of days. There are different types of people who go to yard sales. There are the ones that I call lookie loos. These are the people who will stop, or just drive by, and just glance around for something to catch their eye. They don’t really take the time to examine anything they simply glance, and then they are on their way again. Common amongst the yard sale crowd are the hagglers. It doesn’t matter what price you are asking it is never low enough for them. If you say, “ten dollars” they say, “five dollars,” if you say, “ten cents” they say, “five cents,” or they want you to throw in extra items for the same price. If you are not willing to give your stuff away they are not interested, they do not want to invest anymore than they have to. Another group is the social stoppers. These people really don’t need anything, they go to the various garage or yard sales as an excuse to talk to people. They will take about five minutes looking over the items for sale and then spend an hour talking about anything and everything to the one holding the sale. Then there are the serious stoppers. These people are searching for particular items, often looking for specific makes, models, and sizes. When they find that for which they are searching they make the purchase for the asking price and often say “Keep the change.” What strikes me about these different groups of people is that you see the same types of groups among those looking for a Church. There are those who just glance to see if something catches their eye. They don’t take the time to investigate a church, learn its doctrines, meet the people. If something doesn’t grab their interest at the start they move on. There are also the hagglers, ones who don’t want to invest too much in church. If you say, “attend three times a week,” they say, “how about once.” You will also find the social seekers at church. These people don’t really care what the church is all about they are just there for some human interaction. Then there are the ones who are serious. These are the ones who are looking for specific doctrine, or teaching, and are willing to meet the price when they find it. Which type are you? “Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you,” Matthew 7:7.
