Today’s Bible Passage

James 4:13-14, English Standard Version.

“¹³Come now, you who say, “Today or tomorrow we will go into such and such a town and spend a year there and trade and make a profit”— ¹⁴yet you do not know what tomorrow will bring. What is your life? For you are a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes.”

Paul’s Portion

Despair may come when things in life don’t seem to be working out ideally. Then shortly after despair enters often desperation sets in. Once a person reaches desperation drastic actions are soon to follow. Drastic actions may take on many forms, but a common aspect of drastic actions is an element of danger. The danger can be physical or even financial, but in desperation one believes it worth the risk. People reach this state of despair, desperation, and drastic actions when they forget about the nature of life. That is to say, when they forget that life can spiral into chaos in the blink of an eye. It doesn’t matter who you are, or what you do no one is immune to the danger of life crashing down. There could be a natural disaster; such as the recent hurricanes, wildfires, and mudslides. There could be financial disaster such as the market crash of past years, or the sudden closing of businesses. There could be the personal crisis of the death of a loved one, or a break up with a loved one. The point of it all is that, as the old saying goes, “Nothing in life is certain except death and taxes.” Since nothing in life is certain, does it mean that despair, desperation, and drastic actions are unavoidable? Certainly not, at least not for the one who is a child of God. Despair comes when life does not go as predicted or desired, but it also comes when one forgets who is in charge of life, all life. Though it may seem at times that everything is spinning out of control, God is in control. People need to remember the lesson from the experience the disciples had on the boat with Jesus. The calmness of the sea disappeared tuning into a raging storm. The disciples were sure that the sea was going to claim the boat and their lives. In desperation they woke Jesus. Then Mark tells us, “And He awoke and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, ‘Peace! Be still!’ And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm.” (Mark 4:39) What seemed to the disciples as a situation totally out of control, Jesus handled with a simple word. If Jesus can calm the skies and the raging sea, surely He has the ability to calm the storms in our lives. Rather than panicking and drastically acting out of desperation, we need to go to the Savior trusting that He can and will take care of our situation. Isn’t the concept of peace, be still preferable over panicked chaos?
