Paul's Portion

Snow days are days of delight for school children. A snow day is filled with opportunities. The news of cancellation of school due to snow causes the pulse to race and the mind to chase right after it. Visions of sledding, skating, hockey, building a snowman, having a snowball fight, and other activities flood the minds of the children as they plan how best to utilize this “free” day. For some it is a reprieve to get homework done, or study for the big test. For parents snow days mean adjusting schedules. It may mean staying home from work, or hiring a sitter. Some lucky parents get to share the day with their children playing in the snow. Even then sacrifices are made. Housework or other plans are put to the side hoping that some time will be made later. Even for children snow days are not always without consequences. Snow days may mean a shortened spring break, or no spring break. Snow days could mean not seeing friends that you only see at school, thus missing them. Snow days could mean a heavier work load when you do return to school. Of course, when you are in the midst of an epic snowball fight these consequences are far from your mind. In this way snow days are a good analogy for sin. Sin presents itself as a fun break from the routine, the norm. Yet, like a snow day what seems fun at the time has its consequences; with death being the biggest consequence of sin, James 1:15. There are other consequences as well. For example, a moment of “sinful fun” might lead to consequences involving one’s health. There could also be consequences with relationships. Just as a snow day effects and involves the parents, sin has an affect on others and can suck others in. Even if you are a “good person” when you associate with sin and sinners you run the risk of becoming corrupted, 1 Corinthians 15:33. Furthermore, just as a snow day takes your mind away from school and sometimes work, possibly causing performance to suffer, engaging in sin takes your time and attention away from spiritual matters. Satan attempts to distract us with “the desires of the flesh and the desires of the eyes and pride of life” (1 John 2:16). Thus, distracted, we fail to “set our minds on things that are above” (Colossians 3:2). Don’t be fooled into embracing a “sin day,” the consequences aren’t worth it!
