Paul’s Portion

Yesterday was March 17, St. Patrick Day. It is also known as the day for “wearin’ o’ the green.” There is a tradition that says you are supposed to wear something green on St. Patrick Day. If you don’t wear green then you run the risk of being punished, usually by being pinched. There are often consequences for not wearing the proper thing. Many places of employment have a dress code, or specific outfit that the employees are to wear. If they do not wear the specified clothing then there may again be punishment or even termination. Obviously in the military it is expected of one that they be properly attired in their uniform with the uniform properly maintained. If one is not in the proper uniform, or if the uniform is not properly maintained, then again there could be disciplinary action. When one becomes a Christian it is expected that proper attire be worn as well. There is the sense of being sure that what you are wearing follows the rules of modesty. Although Paul is speaking of women in his instructions to Timothy found in 1 Timothy 2:9, the rule of modest apparel applies to both of the sexes. This idea of modesty is alluded to in 1 Corinthians 12:23, “Our unpresentable parts are treated with greater modesty.” There is also the Spiritual sense of being properly clothed once one becomes a Christian. To be properly clothed Spiritual means things such as putting on the whole armor of God, (Ephesians 6:11-17 and 1 Thessalonians 5:8), and being clothed with Christ, “For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ,” (Galatians 3:27). One must also maintain ones attire thus avoiding the garment stained by sin, (Jude 1:23). Invariably, there are those who will question a dress code or the importance of wearing a required outfit. People will attempt to get away with wearing what they want instead of what is required. Many times the outfit will be very close to what is required, but will be missing something or will have an additional something. This is found in the Spiritual realm as well. People question the necessity of being clothed with Christ or of putting on the whole armor of God. To answer these objections there is the parable of the wedding feast where the one who is not properly attired is bound hand and foot and cast out into the darkness, (Matthew 22:1-14).
