Today’s Bible Passage

Matthew 21:9, English Standard Version.

“9And the crowds that went before Him and that followed Him were shouting, “Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!”

Paul’s Portion

Today is a day known as “Palm Sunday,” amongst many people who believe that Jesus is the Christ, and who also believe the New Testament account of Jesus’ journey to Jerusalem, His arrest, trial, crucifixion, and resurrection. It is known as Palm Sunday because of the account in John’s gospel of Jesus’ arrival in Jerusalem, “So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet Him, crying out, “Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!” (John 12:13) Stemming from this event there has arisen the tradition in some churches of handing out palm fronds to their members. Sometimes these leaves are made into the sign of a cross, sometimes the people wave them around, sometimes there is a reenactment of Jesus’ ride with the people waving them and placing them in the street, and sometimes they don’t do anything with them except take them home and throw them away after a couple of days. There is also the tradition, mostly among the Catholics, of burning the branches and then using the ashes on “Ash Wednesday”. The purpose of all of these traditions, naturally, is to commemorate Jesus’ entrance into Jerusalem, and to perhaps feel a little closer to Him. The event of Palm Sunday also serves to usher in what is referred to as “Holy Week” or the “Passion Week”. This is the week that reflects Jesus’ last week before His crucifixion culminating with Easter Sunday. It should go without saying that this week is one of the most “Religious” among Christian churches. During this time of year there is a spike in church attendance and participation. It is good that people take this time to remember Jesus and His triumphant entrance into Jerusalem. It is good that people use props to help them celebrate Jesus’ life and accomplishments. It is even good that the secular world has latched onto Easter and turned it into a game of hide and seek. All of these things are good because to some degree they publicize Jesus, and His death and resurrection. Perhaps by waving a palm frond around, or by showing up for service one of two times a year, or even finding an egg, someone gets a little curious about Jesus. That curiosity can grow into seeking and finding the real meaning of Jesus’ last week, and that is a good thing.
