Paul’s Portion

Christians often will express the sentiment of how they long to enter the pearly gates of heaven and hear “Well done good and faithful servant.” (Matthew 25:21) While this is a thrilling expectation I would hope that it is more than simply an expectation for the Christian. That is to say, I hope that Christians don’t wait until they enter their eternal reward to know that they are doing well, and are a faithful servant. Shouldn’t a person know whether or not they are doing a good job while they are doing the job? Typically when a person is given a job or task to perform they are also given instructions on how that task is to be performed. In this way the person performing the task has a way to gauge whether or not the performance of the task is up to par. The same holds true with the performance of being a Christian. Those who desire to be greeted into eternity with, “Well done good and faithful servant,” need to check the instructional manual for how to conduct their task. Naturally, the instructional manual is the Bible, (2 Timothy 3:16,17). Thus, if one follows the instructions found within the Bible, one can be assured that they will indeed hear, “Well done”. Knowing that you are going to hear the Lord tell you that you have done well in His service does not take away from the excitement of actually hearing those words. It will still be awesome to look into the smiling face of the Heavenly Father and know He is smiling because He is pleased with you as His child. Perhaps that excitement will be enhanced by the knowledge you have performed as a faithful servant, and you therefore are confident that you are pleasing the Lord (2 Corinthians 5:9). Still, even though we can be sure that we will hear “Well done,” it is always nice to hear that you are doing a good job. Practically everybody likes to have a “That’a boy” before the task is complete. Even if you know you are doing well it helps morale to hear that you are doing well. This brings up the question of, does Jesus wait until the work is finished, to acknowledge a job well done, or are there times of encouragement and praise while the work is being done? I believe that Jesus does compliment our Christian walk. He does this through the bestowing blessings, as well as using people in our lives to give credence to our Christian walk. How confident are you of receiving a “Well done”?
