### Paul's Portion

Last week as I was traveling down the road I observed a car approaching me in the left lane. We got closer and closer to each other and passed each other. After the car passed me I anxiously looked in my mirrors and especially my rear view mirror so as to further observe this car. You see it wasn't until after the car passed me that I realized, or should I say, remembered that I was driving on an interstate. An interstate that had the East bound and the West bound lanes separated by a grassy median. Yes, the car that passed me was driving on the wrong side of the road. What really kind of disturbed me is the fact that I did not realize he was on the wrong side of the road. Granted I was a little tired and that may have had something to do with it, however, I believe the main reason that it did not click that he was on the wrong side of the road was that his driving looked right. He was not swerving or driving erratically, he was driving normally, just on the wrong side. This made me think about many people and situations in the religious realm. How many times do we observe people on the wrong side of the spiritual road, but it doesn't click because they look right. I am reminded of Jesus' admonition in Matthew 7:15 about false teachers in sheep's clothing. I was lucky with my experience that I was not involved in a head-on collision. There have been many others who have not been so lucky. Likewise, there have been many who have not escaped their encounter with those on the wrong side of the spiritual road. It is not that they were traveling down the road incorrectly. They may have been doing everything right, but then they are slammed by one who is not. Again, it needs to be pointed out that there was not obvious erratic behavior, but just one infraction. This lulls many into a false sense of security and safety. That one infraction, though, could cause serious damage. Therefore, watch how you travel down faith's road, but also be cognizant of the others on the road.
