Paul's Portion

As I walked through a department store recently I had a slight epiphany. I was walking through the electronics department and it occurred to me that there was an enormous amount of items for the sole purpose of entertainment. There were rows and rows of movies, cds, video games, computer games, even some LPs, as well as the devices for such. Then there was the toy section, and a small section for books and magazines. There was literally more entertainment options than one person could experience in one lifetime. Just looking at the movie section there are more movies than a person can watch in a lifetime. Remember this was a department store, not a store that specialized in entertainment, so just imagine the options that might be lurking in one of those stores. As I looked at all of these options for entertaining oneself I wondered if perhaps we have placed too much emphasis and importance on our entertainment. I am not saying that entertainment is bad, or that there is anything wrong with the concept of entertainment. With most things in life it is a matter of priorities and perspectives. To this end, one might do well to remember that, Ephesians 5:16 and Colossians 4:5 both advise to make the best use of time. What also struck me about that department store is the shortage of religious options. I imagine that one could find some "religious" cards amongst the greeting cards, and there is probably a Bible amongst the books, there may even be other "Religious" items scattered throughout the store. Yet, to the best of my knowledge there is not a "Religious" section as there is a toy section, movie section, etc. I was under the impression that department stores were supposed to provide those things needed for life. To see the store's layout one would come to the conclusion that entertainment is much more essential to life than God and religion. This is a sobering thought. Perhaps, one of the reasons for the problems in America is because we have moved the Bible out of the family room, and moved in the big screen TV and surround sound stereo. It is also interesting that the same person who complains about spending thirty minutes in the Bible can spend two hours or longer on the couch watching a movie. Oh, and by the way, reading your Bible could actually be entertaining.
