Paul's Portion

There have been people over the years who have missed out on having a relationship with a significant other due to the fact that they were waiting for their “Soulmate”. Some hold to the notion that in this world there exists one special person for everyone, their soulmate. A major problem with the concept of a soulmate is that too often people equate the idea of soulmate with a perfect relationship. To this end soulmates are at times described as being two halves of a whole who perfectly complement and complete each other. Thus, whenever any problem or trial enters the relationship it is abandoned, and the couple continues looking for their one true soulmate. This could be the reason for the high number of divorces. Is the idea of each person having a soulmate a biblical notion? One would be hard pressed to find scriptures to support the idea of there existing one special soulmate for each person. This is especially true when one considers passages such as 1 Corinthians 7 where Paul gives encouragement that the unmarried stay unmarried. If God has prepared a soulmate for everyone, then it would be going against God's plan to suggest that people not get married, whatever the reason. The real problem, spiritually speaking, with the idea of soulmates is that it basically goes against the teaching of the New Testament as regards husbands and wives. The New Testament, mainly in Ephesians 5:22-33 and Colossians 3:18-19, gives instructions for the proper conduct of Husbands and wives toward each other. That is to say that there are instructions on how to be better husbands and wives. In the fairy tale imaginings of soulmates those who are soulmates automatically know how to be the best partner. Some may argue that the instructions in Ephesians and Colossians are for those unfortunate people who did not wait for their soulmate, but instead settled for a regular mate. This is highly unlikely. It is much more logical to conclude that the scriptures for husbands and wives are not for those who have not found their soulmates, but rather are instructions that allow couples to grow into being soulmates. When problems arise in a relationship, therefore, the parties involved don't give up using the excuse that the other simply wasn't their soulmate. Rather, they work through problems growing as both individuals and a couple, and do mature into soulmates.
