# Today's Bible Passage

Matthew 19:27, English Standard Version. <sup>27</sup>Then Peter said in reply, "See, we have left everything and followed you. What then will we have?"

#### Paul's Portion

Many times when people are talking about the process or the action of repentance they use the analogy of making a "U-Turn". This analogy is coupled with the idea of doing an "About face". While this does conjure up good imagery of making a complete change in your lifestyle, one has to ask if making a "U-Turn" or an "About face" is the best analogy for the idea of repentance. The problem is that with both the "U-Turn" and an "About face" one is going in one direction and then they turn completely around and head back the way in which they just came. If one is making a retreat or retracing one's steps to find the place where they got lost or missed a turn, this is a good practice. However, when talking about one coming to Christianity both of these images are contrary to the conversion concept. When one becomes a Christian it is the farthest thing from a retreat. When one comes to a knowledge, belief, and submission to Jesus Christ, and has their sins washed in the waters of baptism by the power of Jesus' blood this is a victory not a retreat. Likewise, a person is lost before they come to Christ not afterward, so there is no need to retrace one's steps. Another problem with the "U-Turn" and "About Face" analogies is that one would be going back in the way of sin which they once Paul wrote to the Ephesian Christians as well as the walked. Christians at Colossae reminding them of the how they used to walk in the way of the sinful world. (Ephesians 2:2 and Colossians 3:7) This is coupled with language admonishing them about no longer walking in these ways. Repentance, rather than a "U-turn" might best be thought of as a 45 degree right turn. While we are walking in sin we are walking side by side, or parallel, with the devil. When we come to know Christ we turn from the devil and begin to walk with Christ. We no longer walk according to Satan, sin and the flesh, but now walk according to Christ and the Spirit, Romans 8:4. In making a 45 degree right turn we are still walking away from Satan and his path, but we are not walking in the way that we previously walked, as if we made a 180 degree "U-turn". Really, the main thing is that people repent and turn to God, Acts 26:20. A 20 degree turn is better than continuing down the sin path of destruction which Satan would have you walking. So, turn my friend turn, before you get to the end of the road.
