Paul's Portion

It is interesting how different people like and dislike different things. Even members of the same family have different likes and dislikes. There can be two siblings who grew up in the same house eating the same meals that one of the siblings will hate a food they ate growing up, and the other sibling will love that same meal. Naturally there are different things that go into whether or not a person likes a thing, especially if where food is concerned. A person may not like a certain food because of its taste, or odor, or texture, or appearance, or some other reason. While again, it is those very things that cause some other person to love that food. This principle can be applied to just about everything in life. For example, some people dislike a fabric because of its design, or texture, or thickness, while these are the very same things that cause someone else to like that fabric. One could also look at things such as school subjects. A student may dislike a subject in school because of its length, complexity, or even the teacher, but those may be the very things that appeal to another student. The point is, it is fine when people use these sort of preferences when they are deciding whether or not they like a food, a fabric, a class, or a number of other things. However, there should be no deciding factors about whether or not a person likes or dislikes God's word, His instructions for mankind. Granted, there may be some parts of scripture that are not as high on a person's list as others, but there should not be any scripture in a person's dislike column. Unfortunately, the world views this a little differently. According to the world's point of view, Scripture is treated just like food, fabric and everything else. Thus, they like and dislike Scripture because it is too long, or too complex, or too confining, or too confusing, and so on. The thing is, Scripture, unlike food or fabric or most other things were not given for man's pleasure, but for man's salvation. People need to remember Peter said to Jesus, "You have the words of life." (John 6:68) There are a lot of medications that people hate, because of the taste or texture, yet they take their medication. They take it because they realize they need it to live. Humanity needs to get past their finickiness and accept that they need God's word to live eternally. Then they will be able to echo David's thought of "Oh, how I love your Law (Word)."
