### Paul's Portion

Today is Father's Day, a holiday created to honor men who strive, to raise their offspring. While preparing for this day I came across a blog post that used this holiday to make an attack on the Bible. How can one use a holiday to attack the Bible you may ask. The answer is, as usual, by taking things out of context or with a mistaken premise. This blog attempted to throw doubt on the validity of the Bible by pointing out indiscretions of some men. The Blogger quoted things such as Noah getting drunk and naked, Genesis 9:20-25, Lot's drunkenness and impropriety with his daughters, Genesis 19:34-38, Abraham attempting to sacrifice Isaac, Genesis 22, and a slew of others with varying degrees of indiscretion. The point of this blog was that the men discussed were described in the Bible as being Godly men, or approved of God, even though they were guilty of these horrible acts. After each example the Blogger would make some snide comment along the lines of "If you want to be a good father, just do like this man did, because God apparently approved of the action". They read the Bible to see that God can take the imperfect and through His love, grace and mercy make us all perfect. If the Bible were not true, but a fantasy thought up by some old men thousands of years ago, it would not record its heroes as the flawed people they were. Summary of June 2019 men’s meeting:

- I. Concerning the leadership of the Pearl Street church of Christ: It was decided that at this time we feel that it is not the right time to appoint elders, but we want to be constantly moving in the direction of being able to appoint elders in the future. - III. - V. Concerning “Service Projects”: It was decided that there is enough congregational interest, and enough need to engage in service projects. These service projects will be designed to help both the congregation and the community with the purpose of giving God glory and honor.
- VI. Concerning outreach: It was decided that we would not engage in any door knocking programs at this time, however, we will be making materials available for the congregation to distribute to neighbors, friends and family. It was further decided that inquiries will be made into procuring radio and newspaper ads. There will also be an increase in a presence on Social Media
