Paul's Portion

A couple of weeks ago I had my hair cut. I went to the same place where I normally go, which is an inexpensive chain. I imagine that because they do not charge very much for a haircut they can't pay their stylists very much. I believe that is why there is a constant change of employees. I very rarely see the same stylist working there for multiple visits. Thus, I very rarely have the same person cutting my hair more than once. On this occasion, I again had a stylist that I had never before seen. She even stated that she was new. I sat in the chair, she inquired about how I wanted my hair cut, and then proceeded to go to work on my hair. As she was cutting I noticed that her technique was not quite like others before her. This didn't concern me too much as different stylists have different techniques. Well, she finished cutting my hair and asked if it was ok. It was not the best haircut I had ever received, but I thought it was ok, so I paid my bill and left. After all it was just a haircut, and like the saying goes, “IF you get a bad haircut it will just grow out in a couple of weeks.” As the last couple of weeks passed it became more and more apparent that I had received a bad haircut. I don't know if this girl was just inexperienced, poorly trained, or just didn't care about whether or not she did a good job, the result was the same, a bad haircut. Jesus tells us in Matthew chapter 7 verses 15-20 to beware of false teachers, and that you can know the false teachers by their fruit. Fruit can be like that bad haircut. There may be some evidence of it early on, but it will take some time to really show up. Thus, one should pay attention to the early evidence. If there is something that does not seem quite right check on it. It may be that the person has a different style, or it may be that the person does not know what they are doing. Along these lines, continue to check the progress, don't assume that just because they start out correct that they will end correct. The girl who cut my hair began the process correctly, but the end result was not what was expected or desired. Then when you end up with a bad job, go to someone who is able to fix it. Also, remember to not make assumptions, the false teacher may have been improperly taught, or just inexperienced, or they may not care.
