Paul's Portion

For much of the world a favorite bible verse is John 3:16, “For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life.” This verse is a favorite, because it speaks to the possible salvation of people, and people like the idea of being saved. Recently there was a news item about a man who was pulled from a burning car. As bystanders and police rushed to the burning vehicle this man did not wave his rescuers off. Rather, he was thankful for their heroic efforts to pull him from the burning car. There has also been news reports lately of various hikers and mountain climbers who have gotten stuck or lost and needed to be saved. None of those people resented the fact that people searched for them and saved them. When one realizes he is in need of saving he is grateful for the people and the efforts that facilitate his salvation. Thus, it is no surprise that people are excited to read that God sent His Son to save them. There is however, a problem with how some people look at God's plan to save them. The problem is that they read John 3:16 as “For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes should not perish, but have eternal life.” Notice the difference? They left out two little words. Little words can make a big difference, especially if they are these two words, “In Him”. It is one thing to “Believe,” it is quite another thing to “Believe in Him”. To believe simply implies that one has an intellectual understanding and acceptance of the facts. That is to say, one believes that Jesus is the Son of God, that He came to earth, lived, died, was buried, and rose from the tomb. It is wonderful to know of Jesus, and all that He did, but that is not a saving belief. In order for one to have salvation from belief one has to “Believe in Him”. What then does it mean to believe in Jesus? To believe in Jesus means that you believe all of the facts about Jesus, those mentioned above, but you also believe His teachings. It means that you believe that not only is Jesus the Son of God, but that He is the messiah and your Lord and King. It means that you believe that what Jesus taught was the word of God, and thus not open for debate. It means listening to and obeying every word of Jesus. What about you? Do you believe, or do you believe in Him? Your salvation depends upon it.
