Today’s Bible Passage

Luke 8:19-21 , English Standard Version.

¹⁹And Then His mother and His brothers came to Him, but they could not reach Him because of the crowd. ²⁰And He was told, “Your mother and your brothers are standing outside, desiring to see you.” ²¹But He answered them, “My mother and my brothers are those who hear the word of God and do it.”

Paul’s Portion

At times someone may be asked, “Who do you think you are?” Typically, this exchange takes place because the one being asked the question is acting like someone they are not, acting as if they are more important than they really are. It is important to be able to answer the question of “Who do you think you are,” to know who you are, and not act like someone you are not. There is something more important however, than being able to answer the question of “who do you think you are,” and that is the question that we find Jesus asking the disciples in Matthew 16:15, ¹⁵He said to them, “But who do you say that I am?” Many know that Peter answered this question with, “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God,” Matthew 16:16. If this question was posed to people today, “Who do you say Jesus is?” it is probable that there would be a variety of responses. Many would say that Jesus is a mythical person, born out of superstition, and urban legends. Many others would say that Jesus was a great teacher, or philosopher, or even prophet, but that is it. Some take a different approach and respond that Jesus is their best friend, or their lifeguard, or their big brother, or some other such term of familiarity. While it is true that Jesus should be your friend, brother, and lifeguard, there is a danger in identifying Him in such a fashion. That danger, of course, is that one may slight Jesus in the department of His Deity when we see Him as a friend or brother. Therefore, one must be careful that when answering the question of who Jesus is to them that they include Peter’s words and say that Jesus is the Christ, along with any other designation Jesus may have for you, whether it be friend, brother, or prophet. Not answering the question at all is not an option either. Everyone will have to answer the question of “Who Jesus is to them” at some point. If they do not answer this question in this life and this realm, then they will certainly have to answer this question in the next life and the next realm. It is also important to remember what Jesus said about answering this question, ³²So everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven, ³³but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven.” Matthew 10:32-33.
