²⁵Truly, truly, I say to you, an hour is coming, and is now here, when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God, and those who hear will live. ²⁶For as the Father has life in Himself, so He has granted the Son also to have life in Himself. ²⁷And He has given Him authority to execute judgment, because He is the Son of Man. ²⁸Do not marvel at this, for an hour is coming when all who are in the tombs will hear His voice ²⁹and come out, those who have done good to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil to the resurrection of judgment.

Paul's Portion

There is an old expression, "If you can't stand the heat, stay out of the kitchen." The warning is that there is going to be some effort involved, there may even be some pain and suffering that goes along with it. Not that there is necessarily pain and suffering involved in the kitchen, unless I am the one doing the cooking. There is, however, typically heat involved in the workings of the kitchen, thus if heat is not your friend it might be a wise decision to keep your distance from this major heat source. There is one problem with this philosophy, and that is that people need to eat. Therefore, unless you are able to have every single one of your meals prepared by someone else, you will eventually need to get into the kitchen. If every single one of your meals is prepared by someone else, this presents its own unique set of problems. One such problem is the fact that you are pretty much at the mercy of the one preparing the meals, as far as content and quantity are involved. Now here is the thing, Christians need to eat also, but they need the Spiritual food. Paul talked about the Spiritual food of milk, and solid food (1 Corinthians 3, Hebrews 5), but to simplify things think of Spiritual food as God's word. There are those who will say, "Stay out of the kitchen" when it comes to dishing up God's word. They will tell you that the Bible is too hard for you to fully comprehend and your will just get burned if you try to go into it. Likewise, there are many people who are perfectly content to let someone else prepare all of the Spiritual food for them, their Bible studies, sermons and devotionals. Like mentioned above with real food, this leaves one at the mercy of the one preparing the Spiritual food. You may be wanting milk and they are attempting to shove solid food down your throat, or you may want solid food, but they are only serving up milk. Christians need to get in the Spiritual kitchen and cook up some Spiritual food for themselves now and then. You don't have to be a gourmet cook, just make sure it isn't spoiled. Feeding oneself is what Paul told Timothy to do in 2 Timothy 2:15. It is also the thing for which the Bereans were praised in Acts 17:11. Christians need to learn how to feed themselves, even if they don't care too much for the heat. Don't be surprised if as you start to prepare your own spiritual food you just may find yourself cooking for someone else.
