### Paul's Portion

Sacrifices come in a variety of shapes, sizes, and forms. It is also true that what may be a sacrifice to one person may not be a sacrifice at all for someone else. The person who has plenty of leisure time during the week may be able to devote five hours a week to charity work, without a second thought. In contrast, for the person who works 60 hours a week, plus has other constraints on his time devoting even one hour a week to charity work would be a huge sacrifice. Also, a person who is very talented at a certain task or ability may be able to use that talent or ability to help with numerous projects, and it be no sacrifice at all. In contrast, for the person who has two left thumbs it would be a huge sacrifice to undertake even one project. Then of course there is the example of monetary sacrifice. Someone who has more than enough funds to sustain their family and home could make much larger donations than the one who is barely scraping by. God understands all of this. That is why He set up provisions for the less fortunate, (Leviticus 5:7, 14:21 etc). This is also why Jesus pointed out to the apostles the poor widow who put in the two mites, Mark 12:41-44. Everyone, can and should make sacrifices in life, especially when it comes to serving the Lord and humanity. Is what you are contributing in time, talent, finances, and what ever else it may be, a sacrifice or is it simply skimming a little off the top. If it is a sacrifice then there is no need to feel ashamed or discouraged by how small or large it is. On the other hand if it is no sacrifice at all, then there should be shame, and regret. Especially when we remember the sacrifices that others have made for us, so that we could have the life that we have. More importantly, when we remember the sacrifice Jesus and God made, so that we could have the after life that we can have.
