## Paul's Portion

"Are you comfortable?" How often have we been asked this question, or asked it ourselves of someone else? Being comfortable seems to be a necessity of life for many people, especially in the United States. We make our furniture big and comfy, our houses cozy and warm, even our cars have adjustable and heated seats, all this to ensure we are comfortable. This desire to be comfortable comes into the religious world as well. We do all that we can to make people comfortable in our places of worship. It started with padded pews, but it has gone way beyond that. We not only have padded pews, and footrests, but now in our places of worship there is ambient lighting, soothing music, cozies, and even coffee shops. This again is all in an effort to make the attendees comfortable. This is not to say that people should not be comfortable. Rather, there is a caution that comfort is becoming too much of a priority. It is also interesting to imagine what the early Christians think about our desire for comfort. It is doubtful that Zacchaeus was very comfortable in that tree, Luke 19:4, or Paul and Silas in that prison cell, Acts 16:24, or any other of numerous examples. The sad thing is that our desire for comfort in our churches does not limit itself to bodily comfort. There is an equal striving for comfort when it comes to the Gospel message. Too often the importance is placed more on the attendee's being comfortable with the message than on the truth, validity, and power for salvation of the message. Again, it is interesting to think how Jesus and the early Christians would respond to this thinking. We know that Jesus wasn't too concerned with His hearers being comfortable with His message, because He upset them often. Paul also, was more concerned with the truth, Galatians 4:16, 1 Thessalonians 2:4.
