Paul's Portion

There is a joke about a lady who sees a young boy being nice to his little sister. She asks the boy how much he gets for being nice The boy replies that he doesn't get anything. The lady then says, "you mean you don't get paid for being nice?" To which the boy responds, "No ma'am, I'm good for nothin'." In this scenario it is humorous for the boy to say that he is good for nothin', but there are many cases where people feel that they really are "good for nothing." In these instances the idea is not that they are not being paid for being good, but that they have no value in and of themselves. Can we really say that there is anyone who is "good for nothing"? Is there really anyone who has no value at all? Many times when we speak of someone as being "good for nothing" we mean that they do not contribute to society. I propose that there is not one human living; not one human that has ever lived; nor any human who ever will live who is truly "good for nothing". Every person has a value, and that value is known by God. C.S. Lewis has a quote concerning Christ that goes, "He died not for men, but for each man. If each man had been the only man made, He would have done no less." God does not see any one as "good for nothing". God sees everyone as so valuable that He paid for them with His Son's blood. We are familiar with Romans 5:8, "but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." By the world's standards we, as sinners and reprobates, were good for nothing, but God saw our value and sent His Son. Some may try to bring up the antediluvian crowd and say that they must have been a bunch of good for nothings even in God's sight, since God only spared Noah and his family. They forget that God wanted to save more than Noah and his family. Peter writes in 1 Peter 3:20 that God had patience with the world while the ark was being prepared, and 2 Peter 2:5 states that Noah was a herald of righteousness. When you put these two together it seems obvious that God was using Noah as a final attempt to reach the wicked people. Even in those days God saw value in humanity, if they would just accept Him. Therefore, never doubt that God sees value in you, and never think that you are good for nothin'
