Paul's Portion

This past week there was an aviation tragedy claiming the lives of all on board. There has been much news coverage and even special programming on some cable stations. The coverage has not been over the crash per se, but rather over one of the victims of the crash. This particular victim was a famous sports celebrity (Retired). Just a few days after that tragedy a Us Military plane crashed in Afghanistan killing the two personnel aboard. While there has been extensive coverage and discussion over the death of the sports celebrity there has been minimal coverage and discussion over the two military personnel, or for that matter even the other victims of the crash in which the celebrity was killed. Here is the question, why does the death of this celebrity warrant so much more attention than the death of the other victims or the deaths of the military personnel? Granted his death was tragic, but was it any more tragic than the deaths of all of the others? People have been talking about him, saying how he was a great player and a good man. To hear some of the commentators one might come to the conclusion that this sport star was worshipped. This is where the problem lies. This man could have been a great player and game innovator. This man could have been a good man, who gave of time and resources for charitable events. This man could have been a good father and husband. He could have been all of these things, but he was still just a man. Furthermore, as a man he was no better or worse than any of the other men and women who die each and every day. This man's death was a tragedy; as was the death of the other nine people aboard that craft; as was the death of the two service men. The real tragedy, however, is if these deaths occurred with the people outside of a saved relationship with the Lord. See there was another tragic death that occurred roughly 2000 years ago. It also, was the death of a man, a good man and one who was great at what He did. This man, however, was more than a man, He was the Son of God, and God sent Him so that the world might be saved through Him. (John 3:17) Each and every life that ends with the person not being saved through Christ (As scripture defines it) is tragic and should get the attention that this sports star's death has received. Perhaps, then more would realize their need for Christ and not have a tragic death.
