Paul's Portion

Something that has bothered me for quite awhile is the concept of "Fashion Police". Probably everyone is familiar with the idea of fashion police, but in case there is one who is not I will briefly explain. Fashion police is where a person or a group of people criticizes what someone else is wearing. It seems to be more and more prevalent in our current culture. There are television shows and segments of magazines dedicated to the idea of fashion police. This practice bothers me for a number of reasons. For one; quite often those doing the criticizing of what others are wearing are wearing outfits that are ridiculous. What gives them the right, what makes them think that they can tell others what to wear? I am reminded of the passage, "Judge not, that you be not judged. For with the judgment you pronounce you will be judged, and with the measure you use it will be measured to you," Matthew 7:1-2. Actually when we are asking what gives a person the right to tell another what to wear there is a place where we can go. If we are going to criticize what people are wearing and try to tell them what to wear it should not be based on the current trends but on the words of Paul, "likewise also that women should adorn themselves in respectable apparel, with modesty and self-control, not with braided hair and gold or pearls or costly attire," 1 Timothy 2:9. Another problem I have with the "Fashion Police is that when they criticize people's attire it is usually because they are not wearing the latest trends. Being a slave to the latest trends brings another passage to mind, "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect," Romans 12:2. The final problem I have with the "Fashion Police" is that they operate on a basis of double standards. They feel that they have the right to tell other people what to like, what to think and how to feel when it come to fashion, and they criticize anyone who does not agree with them. However, if you try to criticize them in some other area of their life, such as their lifestyle you are called intolerant and a hater. With this also, if we criticize other's lives we should not rely on our ideas and opinions but on God's word as David writes, "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path," Psalm 119:105.
