Paul's Portion

In school teachers give the warning that something could go into a student's permanent record. The use of that word “permanent” gives the idea that this would follow a person for the rest of their life, even beyond the grave. I actually doubt the permanence of permanent records. I have not checked for many years, but I have a suspicion that my permanent record went into the circular file long ago. There is also the matter of a permanent marker. The very name suggests that any mark made by this marker would last forever. In fact many mothers over the years have experienced great stress at finding their toddler with a permanent marker in its hand. Yet, permanent marker is not permanent. A web search will reveal numerous ways to remove permanent marker marks or stains. Indeed there are many things of which we say that they are permanent. Webster defines permanent as “Durable; lasting; continuing in the same state, or without any change that destroys the form or nature of the thing.” By this definition to say that something is permanent is the same as saying it is eternal. Yet, probably everyone realizes that permanent records, permanent markers, permanent hair-dos and other such things are not eternal. Permanent then has come to really mean something that lasts for a long time, or is hard to remove. A sad side effect of the weakening of this word is that people doubt the permanency of anything. In 2 Corinthians 3:11 Paul wrote, “For if what was being brought to an end came with glory, much more will what is permanent have glory.” (ESV) It is important to realize that the “permanent” that Paul is referencing here is the New Covenant, the Gospel. With people's watered down version of permanent, however, they replace permanent with temporary. This allows them to have the philosophy that this is only until something better comes along. This is why we have people constantly looking for new revelations or new understandings. This is not the way that it should be. Paul did not write temporary. The Greek word that he used meant stay, continue, remain. The Gospel is not a temporary fix it is the eternal plan of God. There will not come a new and improved version. It is the message by which we are saved, Acts 11:14 which was delivered once for all, Jude 1:3. God's covenant is a true permanent that interestingly can lead to stain removal.
