Paul's Portion

You may hear people use the excuse that they are simply a product of their environment. If they get in trouble with the law they say that it is because they came from a troubled childhood, or home life. Likewise if they get reprimanded for not doing well at their place of employment they say that it is not their fault, they lacked a strong role model. There are naturally other examples that could be mentioned, or various takes on the ones already mentioned. So then the question is this, are people slaves to their environment and their upbringing? Can a person rise above their circumstances to making something good out of something bad? To answer this question it may be wise to consider Hezekiah the son of Ahaz. Hezekiah was a king of Judah and it says of him, "he did what was good and right and faithful before the Lord his God." 2 Chronicles 31:20. It goes on to say that all that Hezekiah did in service to the Lord he did with all of his heart. To put it simply, king Hezekiah was a great servant of God living his life to please the Lord, (He did make some mistakes including a big one that brought God's wrath upon him). Why is this such a big deal? This is a big deal because Hezekiah was the son of Ahaz. Ahaz obviously was also a king of Judah, but it says of Ahaz, "He did not do what was pleasing in the sight of the Lord his God," 2 Kings 16:2. In fact Ahaz did some pretty ungodly things in his short reign of sixteen years as king of Judah. This was the home in which Hezekiah grew up. Hezekiah became king at twenty-five, this means that he was nine when his father became king. This is important to note because it means that during the most formative years of his life Hezekiah watched his father defy the Lord and the Lord's commands. Despite this Hezekiah was a good king and did what pleased the Lord. That apple fell far from the tree. He was not a chip off the ol' block. This all goes to show that we do not have to give in to our surroundings. We do not have to follow in our parents footsteps, if those footsteps are not going down the right path. We can choose to be our own person, by choosing to be God's person. We do not have to let our environment influence and control us rather we can influence and control our environment. Do not conform to this world, after all we are only here for a short while.
