Paul’s Portion

Many preachers, while they are delivering their message, will prompt their audience with “And the people all said Amen.” They will usually do this at a point in their sermon that they feel is especially relevant or powerful. Naturally, they are attempting to elicit a response from the audience. On a deeper level they are hoping that their audience will approve of the point which is being made. At the very least the preacher is attempting to ascertain if the audience is awake and listening. Many times the audience is accommodating to the preacher and will respond with an “Amen.” Perhaps, audiences need to be a little more resistant to offering up their Amens. The term amen very loosely means, “So be it.” Thus, when one says amen to a statement what they are doing is agreeing with that statement. To take it to the next level, when one offers up their “Amen” what they are doing is stating an oath that they go along with the statement and will reflect that in their lives. One may ask, “So what is the problem with that?” There is not really a problem, just a suggestion that one realize what they are getting themselves into. There are at least two cautionary tales from scripture concerning this topic where the actual words of “Amen” are not said but it is the same sentiment. The first is found in Joshua 24:14 where the people say, “Far be it from us that we should forsake the LORD to serve other gods”. This is their “Amen” to Joshua’s statement of “choose this day whom you will serve”. Yet we know that the People of Israel did go after other gods. We can also look at Matthew 26:35 and Mark 14:31 where the apostles in essence said “Amen” to Peter’s statement of “Even if I have to die with you I will never disown you.” Though they emphatically cried out “amen, amen” the reality is that they did disown Jesus and fled for their lives. The point is not that one should never cry out “Amen, amen,” but that when one does make sure to back up your words with your actions.
