### Paul's Portion

The pandemic is still wreaking havoc in the world. One of the main ways that people are reacting to the pandemic is criticizing the medical watchdogs. In Ohio the criticism of the Health Director, Dr. Acton, caused her to resign from office. Surely the Doctor is frustrated over the people's objections, because she is only doing what she feels is best for the health and protection of the people. Despite her efforts it seems the populace is willing to risk infection as long as they can live their lives the way they desire. To state it another way, it seems people are wanting to see just how close they can get to the disease without contracting it. Ministers can relate to the frustration Dr. Acton must be feeling. Ministers have been dealing with this mindset of humanity for centuries. Ministers will give advice on how they perceive what is proper conduct or lifestyle based on what the Bible teaches. The advice is often met with objections. People will claim that ministers are attempting to quench life. Very often, when confronted on a questionable behavior many professing Christians will respond with, "The Bible doesn't say I can't do it." It seems as though they are trying to see with just how much they can get away, how close to the edge they can walk, "Flirting with danger." To be blunt this attitude is basically saying that it is worth the risk of eternity in hell as long as one can live life as one wants. While it is true that there are quite a few things that are not specifically forbidden in the scriptures; silence does not necessarily mean approval. Granted, silence does not necessarily mean disapproval either. What then is the answer? God has given us brains and wisdom, thus, we look at verses such as 1 Thessalonians 5:22, "Abstain from every form of evil," and the list of works of the flesh in Galatians 5:19-21, focusing on, "things like these," in verse 21. We then come to realize that if God had listed every "Wrong" conduct the Bible would be longer than War And Peace. Instead He gave us guidelines, and trusts us to use the brains He gave us to make the right decision. If we lack wisdom in any of these we simply pray for more wisdom, James 1:5. Instead of seeing how close we can live to the world and still avoid Hell, why not see how far away from the world we can live and assure Heaven?
