Paul's Portion

Today is Father's day, so happy Fathers' Day to all of the fathers, but what exactly is a father. The obvious answer to this question is that a father is a male who has sired offspring. This, however, is not an accurate definition, or explanation of who or what is a father. There once was a billboard that stated, "Any guy can have a kid, but it takes a real man to be a father". Another point to consider is that some of the best fathers are not so biologically. A good case in point would be Joseph. We do not know anything about Joseph beyond him taking Jesus and Mary to Nazareth, but we can surmise quite a bit about the type of father he was. Thus, to answer the question of what is a father, one could go to the Bible to examine the examples of fatherhood contained therein. A benefit of going to the Bible to learn about being a father is that within its pages one can see examples of outstanding fathers, as well as examples of men who did not quite measure up as fathers. An example of a bad father is the Moabite king depicted in 2 Kings 3 who sacrificed his eldest son as a burnt offering when the battle didn't go his way. We learn from this example that a good father does not punish his children for their own shortcomings. Another example that can be examined is Eli. Eli was a priest and a man of God, but he was not a very good father for his sons were blasphemous scoundrels. It is true that Eli scolded them for their behavior, 1 Samuel 2:23-25, but in 1 Samuel 3:13 the Lord accuses Eli of not restraining his sons' behavior. We learn from this that a true father is one who trains his children to follow the Lord and be pleasing to Him. An example of a good father can be seen in Job who would regularly offer up prayers and offerings for his children, just in case they had committed an offense against God. There are also examples such as David who on the one hand failed to discipline his sons Adonijah, 1 Kings 1:6, Amnon, 2 Samuel 13, and Absalom, 2 Samuel 14. On the other hand according to the writings of Solomon David taught his children in the ways of the Lord. We learn then that a good father disciplines in love and trains up a child in the way of the Lord, Proverbs 22:6. A father then is one who always acts in the best interest of his children, especially where the Lord is concerned.
