Paul's Portion

It used to be common when movies, television shows, or print media dealt with aliens coming to Earth the alien would approach humans and say, "Take me to your leader". To whom that alien is taken could very well depend on the person that they approach. Perhaps many people would think political, and take the alien to a government official, the mayor or all the way up to the president. Then there are others who might be in the military and take the alien to their commanding officer. Still others might be thinking vocational, thus they would take the alien to their boss or the CEO. Another group of people could understand this familial, they would take the alien to their parents or perhaps a spouse. Then there are those who, if they were being honest, would have to take the alien to a mirror, since they live mainly for themselves. The big question, however is this, if a Christian was approached by an alien and told to take him to their leader, to whom would they go. A Christian should not take the alien to the mayor, or president, or any one in any earthly government. Paul affirms that citizenship for the Christian is in heaven, Philippians 3:20. It would also not be accurate for a Christian to take the alien to his general or commanding officer. While a Christian may serve in the military here on earth, he is truly a soldier of Jesus Christ, 2 Timothy 2:3. Likewise, Christians are to be in the workforce, 2 Thessalonians 3:10, but even though they have earthly bosses, they are to truly work for the Lord, Colossians 3:23. What about family? It is right for the Christian to obey one's parents, Ephesians 6:1, and to have a good relationship with one's spouse, however, God is the Christian's ultimate father, Matthew 6:9, and Christ the ultimate spouse, Ephesians 5:25-27. Then there is the issue of having self as one's leader. Christians are to be selfless not selfish. Christians are to deny themselves and take up the cross, Matthew 16:24, remembering that God opposes the proud, James 4:6. When all of the scenarios are examined it is obvious that in all situations the Christian's leader is God/Jesus. Thus, if ever approached by an alien the Christian should take that alien to Jesus. While waiting for the aliens to show up why not get in some practice and take some fellow humans to your leader.
